Immerse yourself in the captivating world of Pre-Raphaelite art through the evocative power of scent at Watts Gallery. Engage your sense of smell and gain a new appreciation for the artists' intentions and the cultural context in which they created their works. This exhibition includes 3 bespoke scents, created by Puig in collaboration with Artphilia and AirParfum, that are inspired by key elements within selected Pre-Raphaelite works.

Featuring the works of renowned artists such as Eleanor Fortescue-Brickdale, John Frederick Lewis, John Everett Millais, Evelyn De Morgan, G F Watts, Simeon Solomon, and Dante Gabriel Rossetti.

This exhibition originated at <u>The Barber Institute of Fine Arts</u>, and has been expanded by Watts Gallery to include seven new paintings.




#### Peter Brookes: Political Cartoonist of The Times

Watts Contemporary Gallery is delighted to present an exhibition of one of the UK's most iconic satirical cartoonists. *Peter Brookes: Political Cartoonist of the Times* features a selection of Peter's cartoons over the turbulent last 12 months, commenting on national and global events, as well as his regular *Times* cartoons and the *Nature Notes* series.





#### Women of Influence: The Pattle Sisters

27 November 2025 - 4 May 2026

Discover the untold story of seven remarkable sisters whose influence rippled through the worlds of art, literature, photography, and society in the 19th-century. Nicknamed "Pattledom" by the writer William Makepeace Thackeray (1811-1863), the sisters' world was one of rich cross-cultural exchange, where Anglo-Indian heritage, European influence, and artistic experimentation converged in a vibrant social sphere that defied Victorian convention. Whilst the photographer Julia Margaret Cameron (1815–1879) is today the most celebrated of the sisters, this exhibition uncovers their collective impact. Through rarely seen portraits, evocative photographs, treasured possessions, and new research, discover how their influence extended from Calcutta, India (now Kolkata) to Kensington, and from the salons of Little Holland House to the Bloomsbury Group.

# Workshops

## Pottery in practice

Weekly on Fridays, see website for fortnightly themes £45 | Members £40.50

Join Watts Gallery's resident potter Bahareh Khomeiry on Fridays for a creative and inspiring pottery workshop, exploring a variety of techniques and skills. This workshop is suitable for all skill levels, whether you're new to the world of clay or an experienced potter. Each session is standalone with themes changing fortnightly, so take part in a one-off workshop or attend regularly to develop your pottery skills.



# <u>Inspired at Watts: monthly artist-led</u> <u>workshop</u>

Saturday 23 August, 20 September and 18 October 2025 £60 | Members £54

Head to Watts Gallery for a creative monthly workshop series led by professional artists. Each session offers the chance to explore new materials, techniques, and ideas, taking inspiration from the surrounding woodland, historic collections, and changing exhibitions. Whether you're an experienced artist or just starting out, these sessions are a space to experiment, learn, and be inspired.



#### Pottery course: handbuilding techniques

Five-week course on Fridays, 5 September - 3 October 2025

Join a five-week ceramics course led by ceramicist Bahareh Khomeiry, designed for all skill levels. Explore a range of handbuilding techniques, including pinch, coil and slab construction, as well as a range of surface decoration techniques. This course offers a welcoming, creative space for anyone looking to refine their craft or try something new.



## Pottery: beginners throwing course

Five-week course on Wednesdays

Course 1: 10 September - 8 October 2025

Course 2: 15 October - 12 November 2025

The five-week beginners throwing course at Watts Gallery, taught by resident ceramicist Bahareh Khomeiry is perfect for those new to the wheel. Experiment with various techniques, focusing on learning and practice. By the end of the course, you will produce up to four hand-thrown pottery pieces which you will be able to decorate using slips, sgraffito and underglazes.



#### Pottery: throwing taster sessions

Weekly on Thursdays, starting 11 September 2025 (no session on 30 October)

Head to Watts Gallery for a special opportunity to try your hand at wheel throwing with resident potter, Bahareh Khomeiry. In this hands-on taster session, you'll learn the fundamentals of throwing; preparing, centring, opening, and pulling clay to create your own unique forms. Choose as many pieces as you wish to be fired and glazed (at additional cost of £5 per piece) as a lasting memento of your experience.



# <u>Sculpted caricature masterclass with Jethro</u> Crabb

Join sculptor Jethro Crabb at Watts Gallery for a unique one-day masterclass exploring the expressive art of sculpted caricature. Learn how to capture personality through form, by accentuating key features and revealing the essence of your subject. ## Masterclass: oil painting
